PATRICK KOLOWITZ

Hello, my name is Patrick Kolowicz and I'm passionate in providing leadership, expertise and knowledge as it relates to Addictions and Mental Health. I contribute more broadly at a "systems level" in a number of different ways. I'm currently a member of the Ontario Mental Health and Addictions Oversight Table led by the Mental Health and Addictions Centre of Excellence (MHA CoE). The goal of the MHA CoE is to establish provincial strategy, and by doing so recognize that mental health and addictions care is a core component of an integrated health care system. I was fortunate to co-author of the provincial Addiction Mental Health Ontario (AMHO) 2021 Withdrawal Management Standards. I've been involved in a number of other provincial consultation tables such as Provincial Substance Use COVID-19 Recovery Expert Group and the Provincial Steering Committee for AMHO's anti-racism, equity, diversity and inclusion (EDI) frameworks that helped to inform the existing EDI framework from Ontario Health. My goal within this work is to bring a voice from within Windsor-Essex at provincial planning tables.

Here at the local level, I participate in a variety of leadership functions as it relates to Addictions. I'm currently the co-chair of the Windsor Essex County Opioid & Substance Strategy (WECOSS) Leadership Committee, our local public health strategy supported by the Windsor Essex County Health Unit (WECHU). I've been involved in many WECOSS projects and co-chaired the Treatment and Recovery Pillar for over 5 years. I supported the WECHU Stakeholder's Advisory Committee for the Consumption Treatment Services (CTS) and was responsible for providing temporary operational support for the CTS (SafePoint). I've been involved in a number of different research activities to help advance addictions knowledge. I was a collaborator in a research project and international conference called "Caring for the Caregiver" in 2021. I was a project lead for the community implementation of Breaking Free Online (BFO), a digital tool to support individuals with addiction. In my current role I've been blessed with the opportunity to lead our Patient and Family Advisory Council for over 7 years.

My philosophy around addiction is that as a community we both deserve and require a comprehensive menu or range of specialized services. This includes a specific focus on prevention and education, harm reduction, treatment, and law enforcement and justice. Brentwood provides both unique and specialized services within this larger menu. I've heard many stories of success and recovery from both individuals in families that would not have been achievable without Brentwood. It's both a pleasure and an honor to support the mission, vision and values of such a vital and trusted organization, with deep roots within the history of Windsor-Essex.
